Quarterly Implementation Progress Report

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This Quarterly Implementation Progress Report (#9 has been prepared in pursuance of Section II A (1) of the Project Agreement and covers the period from 1st April 09 to 30th June 09 [the Quarter].

Till 30th June 2009, total receipt of funds to PRBDB for PSRSP is Rs. 539.82 Crores. Rs. 382.28 crore were received from WB and GOP has contributed Rs. 157.53 crore.

A total of Rs 582.29 Crores has been spent on the Project including Rs. 60.56 crores during the Quarter.

Total loan disbursed by WB till June 09 is USD 106.19 Million (42.48 %).

Current forecast for requirements of funds for the next two quarters (beginning 1st July 09 and ending 30 Dec 09) is Rs 97.18 Crores. Net requirement of funds from the World Bank during next six months is Rs. 34.42 Crores.

A limited World Bank mission comprising of Task Team Leader visited Punjab from May 6 to 7, 2009 to hold discussions on Output and Performance based Road Contracts (OPRC).

The Midterm Review and Fifth Implementation Support Mission of PSRSP was undertaken from May 23 to 29, 2009. Mr. Ben Eijbergen took over as Team Leader from Mr. Mitsuyoshi Asada after completion of this mission.

Progress on UG/1 & UG/2 remained slow, but rehabilitation works have been sustainably completed. The work on Chandigarh Landran Sirhind Corridor (RH/2) was completed during the quarter.

Pursuance to decision of the Tender Evaluation Committee to re-bid the work for rectification of the defective reaches of Sunam Badbar Road (PM/3a), Notice for Invitation of Bids was published on 6th June 09. Last date for receiving of the bids is 8th July 09.

Following issuance of purchase order to the lowest bidder, M/s Asim Industries Pvt. Ltd, New Delhi, custom duty exemption certificate was issued on 26th May 09 to the agency. 400 GPS instruments are expected to be delivered in first week of July 09.

Under CSC's services, the CV of Senior Quantity Surveyor depending upon his performance on the project was approved for the remainder duration of the assignment. The CV of the proposed Environmental Specialist was approved for a period of three months during this quarter.

The Government's approval on IDS recommendations is still awaited. A meeting to discuss & decide on the recommendations / issues with the IDS Committee members scheduled for 4th May and then on 26th May, 2009 could not take place. The meeting is now likely to be held in the 3rd week of July, 2009

For RAP Implementation, it was agreed with the NGO to complete pending R&R activities by 31st May 09. The additional work of Rs. Rs. 14,04,159/- subject to deductions of Rs. 52,960/- on account of services of a key professional claimed in the first variation order was approved during the quarter.

Under income restoration activity, the NGO hired for RAP Implementation has completed training to 22 batches of PAPs in various fields.

To review progress of OPRC, a meeting with World Bank officials and M/s Opus International Consultants took place on May 7, 2009. In the meeting it was decided that two networks of Bathinda / Malout & Sangrur / Mansa shall be merged as one contiguous network and additional inter connecting roads shall be added to this network. The decision on continuing these services on other two networks shall be made after submission of IR-2 by the Consultant by 31st July 09. Additionally, it was decided to submit Project Concept Document (PCD) for additional funding of USD 180 million (termed as a repeater project) to Department of Economic Affairs (GOI). The PCD was submitted to the Government on 5th June 09.

The HIV / AIDS awareness Consultant is undertaking awareness programs for target population and training sessions of indentified target groups for capacity buildings. The NGO has proposed replacement of Behavioral Science Expert and submitted the replacement CV which was not accepted by the Client.

There is still delay in the completion of GIS based digitization of maps for road network.

For Integrated Transport Policy and Strategy and Strategic Investment Plans study, subsequent to finalization of negotiations with the Consultant, the draft contract was sent to the World Bank for seeking 'No Objection'.

For Road & Traffic Safety awareness, 22 Expression of Interests (EoIs) were received by the due date, 17th Apr 09. The Departmental Committee finalized the short listing of EOIs in the meeting held on 9th June 09.

Creation of Punjab Road Maintenance Fund to be operated under major head "8225-Road & Bridges Fund" was approved by AG on 21st April, 2009 and by Finance Department on 21st May, 2009.

Request for provision of funds to the tune of Rs. 110 crores for Road Maintenance Fund was sent to the Government along with the proposal for appointment of individual advisor for Road Fund Secretariat and declaring Executive Engineer, Provincial Division, Punjab PWD (B&R), Chandigarh as DDO for the operation of this fund under the proposed head.

For Road User Satisfaction Surveys, the Consultant was asked to revise the Pilot Survey Report. The revised report was received in the month of May 09. Meeting of the Review Committee to discuss the revised report is scheduled for 3rd July 09.

The modified RFP for appointment of project consultant for computerization of PWD was submitted to the World Bank on 29th June 09 for seeking 'No Objection' after incorporating series of comments from the bank.

Internal Audit for financial year 2008-09 is ongoing. For hiring Internal Auditor for undertaking internal audit of PSRSP for financial years 2009-10 and onwards, method of procurement is being decided in consultation with the World Bank.

Efforts are being made to rectify observed non compliance of EMP, Traffic Management and workers safety etc. on work sites.

For land acquisition under the Project, Rs. 67.40 crores have been distributed as land compensation and R&R assistance till date, and 93.64% (out of 50.003 acres) land has been acquired so far. For disputed title holding and absentees land owners on UG/1 and UG/2, amount of award under section 11 of LA Act has been deposited with the concerned Sub Divisional Magistrates. Shifting of CPRs is ongoing.

The meeting with Chief Engineer, Punjab State Electricity Board was held on 5th June 09 to review and expedite the shifting of electric utilities along the up gradation road corridors. Shifting of electric utilities on UG/1 & UG/2 is ongoing at slow pace. Shifting of public health is ongoing on UG/1 and for other road contracts it stands completed.

Dispute Boards of UG/1 & UG/2 made site visits during the quarter. No dispute was raised by Employer or Contractor with DB.

On RH/1 and RH/5, the Adjudicator has fixed hearing for 17th July 09 pertaining to the disputes regarding providing, installing, commissioning and testing of street lighting system and revision in price adjustment percentage for all components.

On RH/3, pertaining to the dispute regarding claim of payment against difference of rates between bitumen 60/70 grade and PMB 70 grade for laying bituminous concrete and providing, installing, commissioning and testing of street light system, the Employer has not accepted the decision of the Adjudicator and decided to resolve the matter through arbitration.

Next date for hearing has been fixed for 25th July 09 in the writ petition filed in the High Court by the Gram Panchayat, Pohir. In the case filed by Sh. Ajit Singh and others in the court of the Civil Judge Senior Division, date for hearing has been fixed for 23rd July 09.

During the quarter, the World Bank has forwarded a copy of compliant letter from Mr. Mohinder Singh s/o Mr. Gurdev Singh regarding use of low quality material and constructing road of lesser dimensions from Pakhokay Tappa road, Dist. Barnala by the contractor and claiming false payments in collusion with the staff. The report has been forwarded to Chief Engineer (PSRSP) for verification of facts.

Overall the Project Progress is satisfactory.

1 General

1.1 Reporting Requirements

Quarterly Implementation Progress Report: Eighth Quarterly Implementation Progress Report (#8, January- March 09) was issued on 15th June 09.

1.2 Loan Status

During this quarter, Rs. 30.00 crore have been received at PRBDB from the World Bank. The World Bank funds amounting to Rs. 90.32 crore were received by GoP on 31st Mar 09 based on the request filed with Controller of Aid, Audit and Accounts, Ministry of Finance, Government of India on 30th December 09.

Total receipt of funds from World Bank ending this quarter is Rs. **382.28 Crores.**Total receipt from GOP, ending 30th June 2009, is Rs. **157.53** Crores.

Thus total receipt for PSRSP, ending 30th June 2009, was Rs. 539.82 Crores (35.98%).

During the quarter, Rs. 60.56 Crores were spent on the Project. Overall expenditure ending 30th June 2009 was **Rs 582.29 crores (38.82%).** [*including PPF of Rs. 5.07 Crores*]

The current forecast of the funds requirement for next two quarters is **Rs 97.18** Crores. The projected requirement from the WB is Rs. 94.73 Crores, but it includes Rs. 60.32 Crores yet to be released to PRBDB by GoP though these funds have been disbursed by the WB. Hence, the net requirement of the funds from the WB for next two quarters is only **Rs. 34.42 Crores**.

Disbursement Claims

Total disbursement made by WB till 30th June 2009 is 106.19 Million USD (42.48 %) against a target of 94.00 Million USD.

During the quarter, one disbursement claim amounting to Rs. 113.58 crore was filed with Controller of Aid, Audit and Accounts, Ministry of Finance, Government of India on 18th June 2009.

1.3 Financial Management

For FY 2009-10, under the head of Account 5054 - Capital outlay on Roads & Bridges (Plan) is Rs.300 Crores.

During this Quarter, the total receipt of funds to PRBDB for PSRSP is Rs 30.14 Crore of which WB remittance is Rs 30.00 Crore [of the disbursed amount of Rs. 90.32 crore, Rs. 60.32 crore yet to be released by GOP to PRBDB], direct GOP remittance is NIL and from other receipts/ income (deemed GOP share) is Rs 0.14 crore (net of TDS).


Till 30th June 09, total receipts of funds to PRBDB for PSRSP is Rs. 539.82 Crores (WB funds 382.28 Crores, direct GOP funds Rs 148.30 Crores and Other receipts Rs 9.0 Crores).

This Quarter, **Rs 60.56** Crores were spent on the Project, including the current liabilities (retention money, security deposits, inter unit transactions etc.) of **Rs. 1.88** Crores. The expenditure on the various components of the Project was Rs **57.53** Crore (+), Advances to the suppliers/ others added to **Rs 10.67** Crores (+) while recoveries of **Rs. 7.64** Crores were affected.

Since the effectiveness of loan, total expenditure (reconciled) on the Project is Rs 577.22 Crores. Total expenditure including that under the PPF is Rs. 582.29 Crores. This is 38.82 % of the total project cost.

1.4 Bank Mission

A limited World Bank mission comprising of Task Team Leader, Mr. Mitch Asada, Mr Ben Ejibergen, Mr. Yitzhak Kamhi and Mr. Rajesh Rohatgi visited Punjab from May 6 to 7, 2009 to hold discussions on Output and Performance based Road Contracts.

The Midterm Review and Fifth Implementation Support Mission of PSRSP was undertaken from May 23 to 29, 2009. The mission was originally intended for the period of May 23 to 30, however, the mission visit was restricted by the rapid unrest occurred in Punjab from May 25 onward, and the rest of the meetings were held in Delhi on 29 May, 09 may after the withdrawal of the mission from Punjab on May 25. Mr. Ben Eijbergen took over as Team Leader from Mr. Mitsuyoshi Asada on completion of this mission.

An interim Bank Mission is scheduled to visit in 3rd week of July 2009 to hold discussions on Output and Performance based Road Contracts and site visits on two upgradation road corridors UG/1 and UG/2.

Status report of agreed action points, during the Fifth Implementation Support Mission undertaken by World Bank is attached at Appendix -2.

1.5 Empowered Committee meeting

No meeting of Empowered Committee was held during the quarter.

1.6 Project Steering Committee meeting

A meeting of Project Steering Committee was held on 26th May 09 to decide on the award of contract to M/s Ecorys Nederland BV for consultancy services for integrated transport policy and strategy and strategic investment plans. Minutes of the meeting are appended at Appendix X.

2 Project Management and Implementation

2.1 Procurement Status

(A) Works

Pursuance to decision of the Tender Evaluation Committee to re-bid the work for rectification of the defective reaches of Sunam Badbar Road (PM/3a), Notice for Invitation of Bids was published on 6th June 09. Last date for receiving of the bids is 8th July 09.

(B) Goods

Following issuance of purchase order to the lowest bidder, M/s Asim Industries Pvt. Ltd, New Delhi, custom duty exemption certificate was issued on 26th May 09 to the agency. 400 GPS instruments are expected to be delivered in first week of July 09.

(C) Services

Status of procurement of services for consultancy packages is as follows:

1. Integrated Transport Policy and Strategy and Strategic Investment Plans (Phase II – Package VI)- The negotiations with the top ranked shortlisted consultant, M/s Ecorys Nederland BV was held on 15th Apr , 22nd Apr and 2nd June

- 09. Following negotiations, the Consultant submitted the revised Financial Proposal with a total cost of USD 995,915. The meeting of Project Steering Committee was held on 26th May 09 to decide upon award of the contract to the consultant, M/s Ecorys Nederland BV. Subsequently, the Draft Contract Agreement was sent to the World Bank on 12th June, 2009. Upon receipt of comments of World Bank on the draft contract on 18th June, 2009, point wise clarification was issued on 19th June, 2009. The World Bank's No Objection is awaited.
- 2. Road Safety Awareness (Phase II, Package VII) 22 EOIs were received by the due date. Meeting of the Evaluation Committee was held on 9th June 09 and short listing of the consultants was finalized. Out of six shortlisted consultants, 3 are national firms and other 3 are foreign consultants. RFP is under preparation.
- 3. Computerization of PWD (B&R) (Phase II, Package XVI) Based on a series of comments from the World Bank on the draft RFP in April, 2009, the final RFP was sent to World Bank for issuance of NO on 21st Apr, 2009. Further set of comments from World Bank were received on 4th May, 2009 which were incorporated in the RFP and resubmitted to World Bank on 18th May, 2009. In June, the World Bank suggested the change in payment schedule in RFP to reflect the actual quantum of work to be carried out by the Consultant. The necessary changes in the payment schedule were carried out and the modified RFP has been submitted to the World Bank on 29th June, 2009.
- 4. Surveys (average network speed, vehicle operating cost, road roughness and road condition survey) (Phase II, Package XIV): World Bank advised in April 09 to follow Quality Cost Based Selection (QCBS) method for procurement of the Consultant for undertaking the surveys and subsequently accorded 'No Objection' to publication of Request for Expression Of Interest (REOI) on 28th Apr 09. Owing to Election Code of Conduct for Parliamentary Elections in the state, the REOI was published in newspapers and dgmarket on 9th June 09. The last date for receiving of EOIs is 9th July 09.

Revised Procurement Plan for the next 18 months is at Appendix - 2A

2.2 Implementation Status - Civil Works

Periodic Maintenance Works

Out of ten Periodic Maintenance contracts in Phase I, for 9 contracts (PM/1, PM/2, PM/3a, PM/4, PM/3b, PM/6, PM/7, PM/10 & PM/11) defect liability period is over. Due to inability of the contractor in removing defects, the defect liability of PM/5 was extended upto 24th August 09.

Pursuance to decision of the Tender Evaluation Committee to re-bid the work for rectification of the defective reaches of Sunam Badbar Road (PM/3a), Notice for Invitation of Bids was published on 6th June 09. Last date for receiving of the bids is 8th July 09.

Rehabilitation Works

There are six Rehabilitation works contracts in Phase I.

During the quarter, the progress on these works was satisfactory and all the works were substantially completed.

The work on Chandigarh Landran Sirhind Corridor (RH/2) was completed during the quarter. On Ferozepur Zira Dharamkot Corridor (RH/1 & RH/5), the physical progress 95.45 % & 94.78 % compared to the schedule of 100 % (as per revised work programme). On Phillaur Nagar Rahon (RH/3) the progress is 98.25% against the target of 100%. On Kapurthala Tarn Taran (RH/4) corridor, the progress is 96.50% against the target of 100%.

Total expenditure on RH works till 30 June 2009 is Rs. 243.82 Crore (98.5% of total contracted cost of RH works)

The status of Rehabilitation works is given in Appendix – 3.

Up gradation Works

There are three Up gradation packages in Phase–I.

During the quarter, progress of work on UG/1 and UG/2 (both ICB contracts) was not satisfactory.

On UG/1, the work on Milestone I was completed within the revised completion date i.e 6th June 09. On milestone II of the road corridor, the progress is 21.04% against the target of 80.62%. The overall progress is 31.88% against target of 82.70%.

On UG/2, for millstone I progress is 53% against the target of 76.61%. With revised completion date of 22nd September 2009 for the milestone, 30.82% slippage was observed. For milestone II, progress is 34.76% against the target of 54.65%. The overall progress is 24.66% against target of 64.87%.

On UG/3, the work has been completed during the quarter.

Total expenditure on UG works till 30th June 09 is Rs. 226.74 Crore (59.7 % of total contracted cost of UG works)

The status of the Up gradation works is provided in Appendix - 4.

Drainage Design:

The mission had concern about the construction of high drains on many contracts including RH2, RH3 and UG3, which are affecting access to many road side properties. It was agreed to explore engineering solution on completed and ongoing drainage works to ensure mitigation of the adverse impacts due to construction of high drains in the built up areas.

Adjudication and Dispute Resolution:

Dispute Board (DB) for ICB Contracts:

The status of site visits made by the Adjudicators on ICB contracts is provided in Appendix -5A.

Adjudication for NCB Contracts:

On RH/1 and RH/5, the Adjudicator has fixed hearing for 17th July 09 pertaining to the disputes regarding providing, installing, commissioning and testing of street lighting system and revision in price adjustment percentage for all components

On RH/3, the Adjudicator gave the decision against the decision of the Employer on 10th May 09, pertaining to dispute regarding claim of payment against difference of rates between bitumen 60/70 grade and PMB 70 grade for laying bituminous concrete and providing, installing, commissioning and testing of street light system. As the decision of the Adjudicator was not acceptable, the Employer decided to resolve the matter through arbitration and subsequently asked the Contractor to

2.3 Custom / Excise Exemption Details

Up to 30th June 09, 243 excise duty exemption certificates [Periodic Maintenance

(19), Rehabilitation (147) & Up gradation (77)] and 49 custom duty exemption

certificates [Periodic Maintenance (Nil), Rehabilitation (21) & Up gradation (28)]

have been issued. During the quarter, 1 excise duty exemption certificate was issued

for rehabilitation works.

The total value of the variation orders has not exceeded 15% of the original contract

price on any contract.

2.5 Consultancy Services

Phase I

Phase I (Package I) - Feasibility Study

Lead Consultant: M/s CES (India) Pvt. Ltd., New Delhi

These services stand completed.

Phase I (Package II- Part B) – Technical Audit Services for Rehabilitation Works

Lead Consultant: M/s EGIS-BCEOM International, France

The services were completed within extended time i.e 30th June 09. The Executive Engineers of the PSRSP dedicated divisions were asked to intimate whether any additional requirement of TAC resources was required beyond 30th June, 2009. As no specific requirement was indicated by any of the project divisions, the Consultant was accordingly requested to demobilize its staff and resources for the TAC services with effect from 30th June, 2009 which would deem to be the completion date for these services.

Phase I (Package III- Part B) – Construction Supervision Consultancy Services for Up-gradation works Lead Consultant: M/s Egis Bceom International, France

Depending on the performance on the project, the CV of Senior Quantity Surveyor was approved for the remainder duration of the assignment. Also the CV of the Environmental Specialist was provisionally approved for a period of three months during this quarter. He was mobilized on the assignment on 14th May, 2009.

On the request of the Consultant, the Client agreed to increase the man months of the senior surveyor to 23.2 from 22 man months. The Consultant was also asked to prepare a design change report in accordance with the provisos of the Contract Agreement. Meanwhile the Consultant indicated that a two day workshop on Contract Management was scheduled in mid July, 2009.

Phase I (Package IV) – Institutional Development Studies Lead consultant: M/s PricewaterhouseCoopers Pvt. Ltd., New Delhi

No action was taken during the quarter for these services. A meeting to discuss & decide on the recommendations / issues with the IDS Committee members was scheduled for 4th May and then on 26th May, 2009 but on both the occasions, the meeting could not take place. The meeting is now likely to be held in the 3rd week of July, 2009.

(Phase I) Package VI - RAP Implementation

Lead Consultant: M/s Development Institute for Systems Alternatives (DISA), Lucknow

The proposal of the Consultant to complete pending R&R activities by May 09 was accepted by the Client and accordingly it was agreed to compete services under the contract by 31st May 2009 without any financial implications as the assignment was on lump sum basis.

The second variation order amounting to Rs. 14,04,159/- for the additional work was approved following 'No Objection' from the World Bank on 28th May 09. This amount was subject to deductions of Rs. 52,960/- on account of services of a key professional claimed in the first variation order. The Consultant was informed about the approved additional amount and the proposed deductions.

During this quarter, no submissions were made by the Consultant. The Consultant disbursed the entitlements as per micro-plan and provided trainings to entitled persons.

Phase II

Phase II (Package II) – Output and Performance based Road Contracts Lead Consultant: M/s Opus International Consultants Ltd, New Zealand

A meeting with World Bank officials and M/s Opus International Consultants took place on May 7, 2009 to review the progress. It was decided in the meeting that two networks of Bathinda / Malout & Sangrur / Mansa shall be merged as one contiguous network and additional inter connecting roads shall be added to this network. The decision on continuing these services on other two networks shall be made after submission of IR-2 by the Consultant by 31st July 09. Additionally, it was decided to submit Project Concept Document (PCD) for additional funding of USD 180 million (termed as a repeater project) to Department of Economic Affairs (GOI). The PCD was submitted to the Government on 5th June 09.

As part of collection of pavement condition data, excavation of test pits, traffic count studies and roughness survey was carried out using Laser Profilometer instead of Benklebeam deflection method originally proposed in the contract agreement.

The Client approved the proposed work order for Falling Weight Deflectometer testing of two OPRC networks of Bathinda / Malout & Sangrur / Mansa. Excavation of test pits, traffic count studies and roughness survey using Laser Profilometer was carried out as a part of collection of pavement condition data. The Consultant also submitted the draft report on Allocation and Mitigation of Risk and Report on Review of Environment and Social Management System and Site Reconnaissance Assessment in May, 2009.

Phase II (Package III) - HIV/AIDS Awareness

Lead consultant: M/s Advantage India, New Delhi.

The NGO proposed replacement of Behavioral Science Expert and submitted the replacement CV which was not accepted by the Client. The Consultant reported that out of the referrals made under the project, 8 people have been tested as HIV +ve along the road corridors.

The Consultant undertook following activities during the quarter for generating awareness on HIV/AIDS:

- 3196 one to one contacts with target groups; 2112 were new contacts and 1084 were follow up cases.
- 386 Group meetings were held with target groups.
- 16 community meetings, 4 magic shows, 8 awareness camps, 14 film shows, 2 quiz competitions, 54 referrals along with 5 medical camps were held for target population.
- Till June 09, total 89 high risk group people (including CSW, MSM, IDU & people tested HIV +ve) are indentified. Counseling to visit ICTC is being provided through regular one to one contracts.
- For capacity building, NGO imparted 3 trainings were to youth club members.
- Distribution of IEC material, poster display is ongoing activity.

Phase II (Package IV) – Reclassification of State Road Network

This Consultancy services are now proposed to be undertaken as a part of consultancy service for preparation of Integrated Transport Policy and Strategy & Strategic Investment Plans Study for Punjab (Package VI, Phase II).

Phase II (Package V) - Preparation of GIS maps for Road network in Punjab

Lead Consultant: M/s CCE, Punjab Engineering College, Chandigarh

Four additional toposheets were received from SoI during this quarter. With this, the receipt from SOI till the end of June, 2009 is 319 sheets + 3 outriggers (for balance area up to international border with Pakistan), out of the total requirement of 366 sheets.

Data after ground truthing was received only from Provincial Division, Jalandhar. Taken note of the delay in this assignment due to passive response of PWD (B&R) for ground truthing, the World Bank agreed to the ground truthing to be undertaken by the Consultant as a variation to the original services. The Consultant has submitted a financial proposal of Rs. 12 lacs for carrying out this additional task which is under consideration of the Client.

Phase II (Package VI) – Integrated Transport Policy and Strategy & Strategic Investment Plans Study for Punjab

The first round of negotiations with the shortlisted Consultant, M/s Ecorys Nederland BV was held on 15th April, 2009. Two other round of negotiations were held on 22nd April, 2009 and 2nd June, 2009. During the negotiations, the key issues that were discussed and finalised include the discussions on data collection, duration of the assignment, removal of Tasks 0 and 7 from the Financial Proposal (being incidental to the project) and Transport demand forecasting and modelling. As a result of the negotiations, the Consultant submitted the revised Financial Proposal with a total cost of USD 995,915. The Client agreed to study the revised Financial Proposal submitted by the Consultant. Meeting of the Project Steering Committee was held on 26th may 09 to decide upon the award on the contract to the consultant, M/s Ecorys Nederland BV. Subsequently, the Draft Contract Agreement was sent to the World Bank on 12th June, 2009 for 'No Objection'. On receipt of comments of World Bank on the draft contract on 18th June, 2009, point wise clarification was issued on 19th June, 2009. The World Bank's No Objection is awaited.

Phase II (Package VII) – Road & Traffic Safety Awareness

During the quarter, 22 EOIs were received. Meeting of the Evaluation Committee was held on 9th June 09 and short listing of the consultants was finalized. Out of six

shortlisted consultants, 3 are national firms and other 3 are foreign consultants. RFP is under preparation.

Following issuance of purchase order to the lowest bidder, M/s Asim Industries Pvt. Ltd, New Delhi, custom duty exemption certificate was issued on 26th May 09 to the agency. 400 GPS instruments are expected to be delivered in first week of July 09.

Phase II (Package VIII) – Road Fund Secretariat

Creation of Punjab Road Maintenance Fund to be operated under major head "8225-Road & Bridges Fund" was approved by AG on 21st April, 2009 and by Finance Department on 21st May, 2009.

Request for provision of funds to the tune of Rs. 110 crores for Road Maintenance Fund and proposal for appointment of individual advisor for Road Fund Secretariat was sent to the Government along with the proposal to declare the Executive Engineer, Provincial Division, Punjab PWD (B&R), Chandigarh as DDO for the operation of this fund under the proposed head.

Phase II (Package IX) – Asset Management Software Development and Training

No action was taken during the quarter for these services.

Phase II (Package X) – Training IT, Contract Management, Quality Control and Procurement

Training on HIMS Software was provided to three PRBDB officials in the month of May by M/s Opus International Consultant as a part of their consultancy services.

A two day workshop on Contract Management is being scheduled in mid July, 2009 by Construction Supervision Consultant, M/s Egis Bceom International, France under provisos of the contract agreement.

Phase II (Package XI) – Training Social and Environmental Lead Consultant: M/s IDMA Foundation for Sustainable Development, Chandigarh

As a part of EMP capacity building, 10 training sessions were conducted for identified target groups and the final training reports has been submitted. The 3rd batch (1st Quarter 2009) pollution monitoring report has been submitted. The 4th batch (2nd

Quarter 2009) of pollution monitoring has been completed during the period 4th May to 19th May, 2009. The preparation of Environmental Monitoring Manual is in progress.

Phase II (Package XII) - Training - Financial Management

No action was taken during the quarter for these services.

Phase II (Package XIII) – Road Safety Database, Training etc Lead Consultant: M/s ArriveSafe, Chandigarh

Beta version of the IDEAS software has been uploaded by the Consultant on internal domain for the testing by the review committee. The comments from the Punjab Police (member of the review committee) are delayed owing to deployment of Police officers in Parliamentary Elections in the state. The feedback from the Police department is expected in July 09.

Phase II (Package XIV) – Surveys (Road user, Pavement condition, speed, etc.)

a) Road User Satisfaction Survey Lead Consultant: M/s Operations Research Group Pvt. Ltd., New Delhi.

The Pilot Survey Report was submitted in the month of April 09. In the meeting held on 28th April, the comments on the report were shared with the Consultant and it was advised to revise the report. The revised report was received in the month of May 09. Meeting of Review Committee to finalize the report was scheduled in the month of June 09 which has been rescheduled to 3rd July 09.

b) Surveys (Average network speed, vehicle operating cost, Road roughness and road condition survey)

World Bank advised in April 09 to follow Quality Cost Based Selection (QCBS) method for procurement of the Consultant for undertaking the surveys and subsequently accorded 'No Objection' to publication of Request for Expression Of Interest (REOI) on 28th Apr 09. Owing to Election Code of Conduct in the state, the REOI was published in newspapers and dgmarket on 9th June 09. The last date for receiving of EOIs is 9th July 09.

Phase II (Package XV) – Feasibility Studies & Advisory Services for Preparation of PPP

No action was taken during this quarter for these services.

Phase II (Package XVI) - Computerization of PWD (B&R)

Based on a series of comments from the World Bank on the draft RFP in April, 2009, the final RFP was sent to World Bank for issuance of No Objection on 21st Apr, 2009. Further set of comments from World Bank were received on 4th May, 2009 which were incorporated in the RFP and resubmitted to World Bank on 18th May, 2009. In June, other set of comments were received from the World Bank. The modified RFP after incorporating all the comments was submitted to the World Bank on 29th June, 2009 for 'No Objection'.

Phase II (Package XVII) – DPR Consultancy for Rehabilitation of affected reaches of PM/6.

It has already been decided not to proceed with any further investigation / consultancy on this road as this road has already been included as a part of list of roads under OPRC consultancy in Phase II of PSRSP.

Phase II (Package XVIII) –Services of Internal Auditor for PSRSP.

Lead Consultant: M/s S.K. Bhasin & Associates, Chandigarh

During the quarter, the Consultant submitted internal audit reports for first half year (FY. 2008-09) for PSRSP Sangrur and Mohali divisions.

During the mission in May 09, the World Bank advised to hire Internal Auditor for undertaking internal audit of PSRSP for financial years 2009-10 and onwards on a competitive basis. Series of communication was exchanged between the World Bank and PRBDB to decide method of procurement to be followed.

Phase II (Package XIX) – External Evaluation of Implementation of Resettlement Action Plan

Lead Consultant: M/s Consultant for Rural Area Development Linked Economy (CRADLE)

The Consultant submitted the Interim Report in May 09. The comments from the World Bank and PRBDB were shared with the Consultant. Draft midterm evaluation report is expected in first week of July 09.

2.6 Implementation of Environment Management Plan

Inspection of Construction Sites

On rehabilitation works contract, majority of civil works in all packages have been completed. Emphasis has been on rehabilitation of borrow areas, disposal sites, site cleaning and completion of enhancement measures identified.

On Up-Gradation works, the implementation of EMP in UG1 and UG2 is still a concern, issues identified are being complied.

Traffic Management: Traffic Safety Management in UG1 and UG2 is still not satisfactory and Engineer has been advised to improve the same.

Workers Safety: The compliance to PPE is still unsatisfactory in all packages. The setting of temporary labour camp/shelter without ancillary facilities is generating unhygienic condition. Engineer has been advised to remove temporary camps and adjust the labour in permanent camps site.

Disposal Site: 1 disposal site at UG1 has been identified during this quarter. There are 17 identified disposal sites i.e. 9 in rehabilitation and 8 in up-gradation package. The Contractors of rehabilitation packages has been advised to start the restoration of disposal sites. The issue of waste earth management in UG1 may becoming a problem as no proper planning is being done before starting of any excavation work. The package wise disposal site identified is tabulated below.

Inspection of Construction Camps

Rehabilitation Works

Under this package there are 5 construction camps. The contractor of RH1/5 has started the rehabilitation of camp site. Similarly, all contractors have been advised to prepare a rehabilitation plan for camp site and start restoration.

Up-gradation Works

With identification of one more construction camp at km 52.820 (LHS) at UG2 package, there are 5 construction camps under up-gradation works. Overall the camp site management is poor in UG1, as no preventive measure has been taken to minimize the bitumen spillage and stacking of bitumen drums. UG2 is at better side in comparison to UG1.

Borrow Areas

In case of rehabilitation and up-gradation, a total of 67 borrow areas have been identified and approved, of which 9 borrow areas in total have been rehabilitated. Contract package wise breakup is tabulated below.

The management of borrow areas in UG1 is an issue due to no proper documentation. The Engineer has been advised to follow proper procedure before opening of new borrow area.

CS Consultant

The Environment specialist has been mobilised during this quarter. The 2 Environmental Officer at both UG1 and UG2 are already available on site. The CSC was advised to improve the implementation of EMP by adopting appropriate monitoring mechanism.

Others

The in-house training needs to be provided on regular basis to both EO, CSC at UG1 & UG2.

2.7 Resettlement & Rehabilitation Activities

Overall **46.823** acres **(93.64%)** of land has been acquired and Rs. **67.40** crores have been distributed as land compensation and R&R assistance.

On UG/1 and UG/2, total requirement of private land is 50.003 acre after revision of COI due to modified drain design. (Details of requirement of land (area) is attached as Appendix A. Under the project, total of 891 title-holders families, 304 non-titleholders families have been identified.

On UG/1 and UG/2, 45 CPRs out of 48 categorized as priority I CPRs (religious/community structures) have been shifted / enhanced. However, 89 CPRs categorized as priority II (bus shelter & foundation stone etc.) shall be shifted as and when required.

On RH/1, RH/2, RH/3 and RH/5 CPR relocation has been completed. On RH/4, one religious structure is yet to be shifted.

Kharar-Banur-Tepla Corridor (UG/1)

- Land Compensation and R&R payment of Rs 5,18,75,251/- (Rs. Five crore eighteen lac seventy five thousand two hundred fifty one only) has been disbursed to the Title Holders and Non Title Holders till date.
- For disputed title holding and absentees land owners, amount of award Rs, 57,00,000/- (Fifty seven lac only) under section 11 of LA Act has been deposited with the concerned Sub Divisional Magistrates.

Ludhiana-Malerkotla Sangrur Corridor (UG/2)

- Land compensation and R&R payment of Rs 64,16,38,590/- (Rs. Sixty four crore sixteen lacs thirty eight thousand five hundred ninety only) has been disbursed to the Title Holders and Non Titleholders. Till date registry fee of Rs 30,73,313/- has been paid to those title holders who have purchased the new land out of land compensation amount received under PSRSP.
- For disputed title holding and absentees land owners, amount of award under section 11 of LA Act has been deposited with the concerned Sub Divisional Magistrates.

TarnTaran-Chhabal-Attari Corridor (UG/3)

 With disbursement of R&R assistance in compliance with supplementary micro plan, R&R activity has been completed in all respects on the road corridor.

Phillaur-Nagar-Rahon-Corridor (RH/3)

 Supplementary Micro Plan to compensate damages to septic tank and other unforeseen impacts is not required now as these have been repaired by the contractor during execution of road work.

Training under Income Restoration:

Under Income Restoration Activity, for imparting training to PAPs in various fields, training programme divided into 22 batches have been successfully concluded on 18th Apr 09.

Drainage:

During the mission, it was agreed that the NGO for RAP implementation would conduct an assessment to identify adverse impacts due to construction of drains above the plinth level of the adjoining buildings in the built up areas along the project roads. It was also agreed that a variation order will be issued to the NGO for these additional services.

Detailed status regarding implementation of Resettlement Action Plan is at Appendix - 10.

2.8 Pre Construction Activities:

A) Works where Forest Clearance awaited:

Rehabilitation roads:

<u>Patiala Sirhind road (RH/6)</u>: Forest clearance for diversion of 1.5 ha of forest land under forest division Fatehgarh Sahib is awaited.

D) Shifting of Electric/Public Health Utilities

Chief Engineer (PSRSP) and Project Director held the meeting with Chief Engineer, Punjab State Electricity Board on 5th June 09 to review and expedite the shifting of electric utilities along the up gradation road corridors.

Up gradation roads:

UG/1:

- The shifting of electric utilities is in progress by the road contractor against variation orders. Relocation of electric utilities, stands completed for milestone I and are ongoing in mile stone II.
- Raising of High Tension line in km 21: It was decided that PWD (B&R) shall acquire the land for installing tower for raising of high tension line. It is expected that land will be acquired by mid of July 09.

UG/2:

On 'Ludhiana Malerkotla Sangrur' road (UG/2), shifting of electric utilities is at slow pace. On the road corridor, the contractor has been given 'Step-in-rights' to shift the utilities. As on date 243 electric utilities (207 electric poles & 36 transformers) on 'Ludhiana Malerkotla' section and 220 electric utilities (107 electric poles and 13 transformers) on 'Malerkotla Sangrur' section are yet to be shifted.

UG/3:

Relocation of utilities stands completed on UG/3.

Rehabilitation roads:

- On 'Zira Ferozepur' road (RH/1), in km 59 to 59.160, shifting of 7 poles is not required now.
- Relocation of electric utilities stands completed on RH/2, RH/3, RH/4 & RH/5.

E) Public Heath Utilities:

Up gradation roads: During the quarter, no progress was made in shifting of pipe line on UG/1. On UG/2 & UG/3, shifting of public health utilities stands completed.

Rehabilitation roads: Shifting of public health utilities stands completed.

The status of shifting of electric and public health utilities on the project roads is at Appendix 11.

3 Seminars, Workshops & Trainings

Under Consultancy Services for Phase II, PSRSP trainings on use of Road Measurement Data Acquisition System (ROMDAS) and related Highway Information Management System (HIMS) was provided to representatives from PRBDB and PWD offices in Rupnagar, Garshanker and Sangrur from 23rd March to 10th April 09 and 12th May to 14th May 09 respectively.

Project Managers, PSRSP, Ms Aparna Gupta and Mr. Ripdaman S. Seth attended the workshop on Project Management held at Chandigarh from 23rd to 26th April 2009.

4 Complaints

During the quarter, the World Bank vide memo dated 25th June 09 has forwarded a copy of compliant letter from Mr. Mohinder Singh s/o Mr. Gurdev Singh regarding use of low quality material and constructing road of lesser dimensions on Pakhokay Tappa road, Dist. Barnala by the contractor and claiming false payments in collusion with the staff. The report has been forwarded to the Chief Engineer (PSRSP) for verification of facts.

5 Court Cases

- The next date for hearing has been fixed for 25th July 2009 in the court case filed by the Gram Panchayat in High Court following signing of conveyance deed with Sh. Malkit Singh & others for khasra no. 10//8,10//9,10//13, 10//14,10//12/2 in village Pohir.
- Court case has been filed in the court of the Civil Judge Senior Division, Ludhiana by Sh. Ajit Singh and others, owners of Khasra no. 1832 against the PWD, Ludhiana stating that without acquiring / purchasing their land, the department has started constructing the road in their land. The case has been fixed for hearing on 23rd July 2009. The matter has been verified by the PM (Social) and observed that no construction activity was undertaken by the contractor in the affected khasra.
