EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This Quarterly Implementation Progress Report (#6) has been prepared in pursuance of Section II A (1) of the Project Agreement and covers the period from 1st July 08 to 30th September 08 [the Quarter].

Till 30th September 2008, total receipt of funds to PRBDB for PSRSP is Rs. 505.99 Crores. Rs 352.28 Crores were received from WB and GOP has contributed Rs 153.71 Crores.

A total of Rs 363.53 Crores have been spent on the Project including Rs. 71.25 crores during the Quarter. This includes current liabilities of Rs. 10.39 Crores.

Total loan disbursed by WB till June 08 is USD 88.38 Million (35.35%).

Current forecast for requirements of funds for the next two quarters (beginning 1st Oct 08 and ending 31 Mar 09) is Rs 237.07 Crores. Net requirement of funds from the World Bank during next six months is Rs. 90.38 Crores.

M/s Opus International Consultants limited, engaged for developing OPRC Package in Phase II, commenced their services from 7th August 2008. As part of consultancy services for OPRC Package in Phase II, first industry consultation workshop was held on 23 Sept 2008. GoP has shown keen interest in implementing OPRC format and has sought to expand the coverage by including additional networks in other parts of the state under OPRC.

The TAC Services re-commenced on 1st July 2008 through Phase 1 Package 3 Consultant (M/s Egis Bceom).

Construction Supervision Consultant (M/s Egis BCEOM), mobilized a new Resident Engineer on UG/1, completed the Training Needs Assessment survey and conducted a training programme on Quality Control testing and procedures on UG/1 & UG/2.

The Government's approval on IDS recommendations is awaited.

'One to one contact for awareness generation' has been commenced by HIV / AIDS awareness Consultant.

The performance of NGO appointed to facilitate RAP implementation remains satisfactory. The agency has claimed the variation for the additional work which is under consideration.

The services for road safety awareness are yet to be procured. M/s ArriveSafe (proposed consultant for Road Safety Awareness) had also indicated its interest in developing a web based Accident Data system. These services are being procured following Single Source procurement procedure. The Contract Agreement is likely to be signed in the first week of October.

Approval to award the consultancy services of Road User Surveys has been received from the Government, and the contract agreement is likely to be signed in the first week of October.

Inadequate submission of digitized toposheets from SOI & slow response from PWD field offices on ground truthing of the submitted sheets is delaying the completion of GIS based maps for road network. Consultant,M/s CCE, has sought further extension of 6 months due to this delay.

For Integrated Transport Policy and Strategy and Strategic Investment Plans study the pre-proposal meeting was held on 18th Aug, 2008. Submission date of Proposals has been extended to 6th Oct 2008.

The Consultant for Training Social and Environmental submitted revised inception report of Pollution Monitoring after incorporating the WB comments. The Consultant has also submitted the Training Needs Assessment survey which is under review. The first batch of pollution monitoring at all construction sites was completed.

The final approval for creation of Road Fund is still awaited from Accountant General Punjab, though the department of Finance has informed that on formal approval from AG the fund shall become operational.

Procurement of Service Provider for Computerization of PWD shall now be done by PRBDB by engaging Project Consultant. EOIs seeking the services of Project Consultant for these services have been sought by November 5th.

Following NO from the World Bank, CRADLE, an experienced NGO, has been shortlisted for External Evaluation of Implementation of Resettlement Action Plan. The NGO has been requested to submit revised proposal after removing the shortcomings of original proposal. For land acquisition under the Project, Rs. 52.61 crores have been distributed as land compensation and R&R assistance till date, and 42.197 acres (84.388%) land has been acquired so far. Shifting of CPRs is in progress on all Up-gradation and Rehabilitation corridors. Grievance Redressal Committee has decided to pay severance allowance equivalent to 25% of the award value to the entitled persons. Accordingly, formal Government approval has been requested.

Continuous efforts are being made to rectify observed non compliance of EMP (Traffic Management, workers safety etc)

Tree cutting is almost complete on all Rehabilitation & Upgradation corridors.

Shifting of public health utilities (on UG/1) and electrical utilities (on UG/1 & UG/2) is in progress albeit at a slow pace.

After prolonged and above normal monsoon season, the progress of civil works returned back to normal.

Progress on UG/1 & UG/2 is still far behind the schedule.

Though somewhat behind schedule, overall progress on rehabilitation contracts is generally satisfactory.

Dispute Boards on all the three ICB contracts (UG/1, UG/2 & RH/4) have came into being after signing of the tripartite agreements between DB, Employer & the respective Contractors.

A training seminar on Road safety, RTI Act and GIS was conducted for PWD officers on 25 July 2008. CSC for UG/1 & UG/2 conducted a training programme on Quality control tests in August. The Consultant also submitted the schedule of overseas training programme. Formal approval of the Government has been requested.

Two court cases pertaining to land being acquired on (UG/2) were decided on 1st August 08, and subsequent to the decision, the conveyance deeds were signed. Next hearing of the Court case (UG/2) pertaining to division of land among share holders is fixed for 1st November 2008.

Action from Director Quality Control cum Vigilance Officer on pseudonymous complaint against the Executive Engineer, Mohali is still pending.

A limited mission comprising of IT specialists & Financial Management specialist visited separately in first week of September. Another, limited WB mission comprising of TTL & OPRC specialist is scheduled to visit in first week of October.

Overall the Project progress is satisfactory.

1 General

1.1 Reporting Requirements

Monthly Progress Reports: During this Quarter (July-September 08), Monthly Progress Reports of August '08 (covering July & August) and September '08 were issued.

Quarterly Implementation Progress Report: Fifth Quarterly Implementation Progress Report (#5, April-June 08) was issued on 19th Aug 08.

1.2 Loan Status

During this Quarter, no funds were received from the World Bank. As counterpart funding, Rs. 38.40 were received from GoP & Rs 0.77 crore were availed from other receipts/income (deemed GoP share).

Total receipt of funds from World Bank ending this quarter is Rs. **352.28 Crores.** Total receipt from GOP, ending 30th September 2008, is Rs. **153.71** Crores.

Thus total receipt for PSRSP, ending 30th September 2008, was Rs. 505.99 Crore (33.73%).

During the quarter, Rs. 71.25 Crore were spent on the Project. Overall expenditure ending 30th September 08 was **Rs 368.60 crore (24.57%)**.

The current forecast of the funds requirement from WB for next two quarters is **Rs. 90.38 Crore** (net of current liabilities).

Disbursement Claims

Total disbursement made by WB is **88.29** Million USD (35.32 %) against a target of **94.00** Million USD (till September 30th 2009).

During the quarter, no disbursement claim was filed with Controller of Aid, Audit and Accounts, Ministry of Finance, Government of India.

1.3 Financial Management

For FY 2008-09, under the head of Account 5054 - Capital outlay on Roads & Bridges (Plan) is Rs. 275 Crores.

During this Quarter, the total receipt of funds to PRBDB for PSRSP is Rs 39.17 Crore of which WB remittance is NIL, direct GOP remittance is Rs. 38.40 Crore and from other receipts/ income (deemed GOP share) is Rs 0.77 Crore (net of TDS).

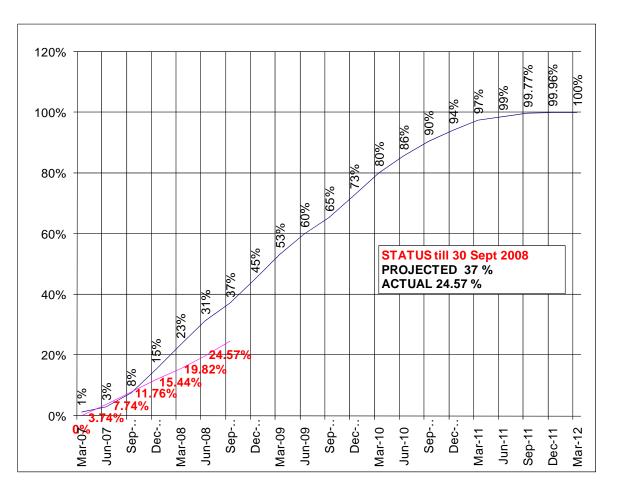
Till 30th September 08, total receipts of funds to PRBDB for PSRSP is Rs. **505.99** Crores (WB funds Rs 352.28 Crore, direct GOP funds Rs 148.30 Crore and Other receipts Rs 5.41 Crore).

During this Quarter **Rs 71.25 Crore** were spent on the Project, including the current liabilities (retention money, security deposits, interunit transactions) of Rs. 10.39 Crores. The expenditure on the various components of the Project was Rs 76.83 Crore(+), advances to the suppliers/ others added to Rs 5.86 Crore(+) while recoveries of Rs.11.44(-) Crore were affected.

Since the effectiveness of loan, total expenditure (reconciled) on the Project is **Rs 363.53 Crore**. Total expenditure including that under the PPF is Rs. **368.60 Crore**. This is **24.57 %** of the total project cost.

The FMR reports are included as Appendix - 1.

Final Internal Audit report pertaining to 1 October 07 to 31 March 08 (six months), was received during quarter. A mechanism of formally addressing the issues raised and accepting such audit reports is being prepared.

1.4 Bank Mission

Two limited WB missions visited separately in the first week of September. First one was led by Mr. Rajesh Rohatgi and comprised of Mr. Shashank Ojha and Mr. Pradeep Valsangkar (IT specialists). The other had Mr. Nishith Dwevedi (Financial Management Consultant) who carried out Interim Review on Financial Management.

Status report (as on 30/9/08) of agreed action points, during the WB Mission (in March 08) is attached at Appendix -2.

1.5 Empowered Committee meeting

9th Meeting of the State Level Empowered Committee(SLEC) for PSRSP was held on 28 Aug 2008, the minutes of which are included as Annex 11.

Mr. Kulbir Singh joined as Secretary Public Works on 25th July 08 in place of Mr. Karan Avtar Singh.

1.6 Project Steering Committee meeting

No meeting of Project Steering Committee was held during this quarter.

2 Project Management and Implementation

2.1 Procurement Status

(A) Works

The Executive Engineer Sangrur has sought bids (to be received by 21 Oct 2008) for rectification of the defective reaches of Sunam Badbar (PM/3a).

(B) Goods

Procurement of GPS instruments for Traffic Wing of Punjab Police was kept pending owing to issue of differential sale tax and its implications on evaluating lowest bid. Reminders are being issued to the excise and taxation departments of Delhi & Mumbai regions for seeking clarification regarding applicable CST/VAT rate on GPS units.

(C) Services

Status of procurement of services for consultancy packages is as follows:

1. **Output and Performance based Road Contracts (Phase II, Package II)** – The draft contact for OPRC was sent to World Bank for NO on 3rd July, 2008. Upon the receipt of NO from the World Bank on 10th July, 2008, the contract Agreement with M/s Opus International Consultants Ltd, New Zealand was signed on 24th July, 2008. The services commenced on 7th Aug 2008.

2. Integrated Transport Policy and Strategy and Strategic Investment Plans (Phase II – Package VI) – The RFP for these services was issued to the six shortlisted consultants on 22nd July, 2008 with last date of submission of proposals being 18th Sep, 2008. The pre-proposal meeting for the services was held as scheduled on 18th Aug, 2008. On receipt of NO from WB, the minutes of the pre-proposal meeting were issued on 29th Aug, 2008. On consultants' request, the last date of submission of proposals was extended to

6th Oct, 2008 from 18th Sep 2008. The corrigendum to this effect was issued on 4th Sep, 2008.

3. **Road Safety Awareness (Phase – II, Package VII)** –– The progress on proposed services of M/s ArriveSafe for Road Safety Awareness was limited to several meetings during this period. The proposed procurement of services of this NGO on Single Source procurement has been kept in temporary abeyance due to pending information from this NGO.

4. **Road Safety Database, Training etc (Phase II (Package XIII)** – M/s ArriveSafe (proposed Consultant for Road Safety Awareness) was identified to to develop web based Accident Data system for multiple data input & wider utility. No Objection was received from the World Bank on 23rd September for procuring these services based on Single Source Selection for developing online Accident data base management system. The contract agreement is expected to be signed in the month of October 08.

5. Surveys (Road User, Pavement condition, speed etc) (Phase II, Package XIV) – Approval of Government for signing of the Contract agreement for the services was received during the quarter. The contract agreement is expected to I be signed in the first week of October 08.

6. **Computerization of PWD (B&R) (Phase II, Package XVI)** – It was decided in a meeting chaired by Chief Secretary with Secretary Public Works, Director IT and PD on 26th Aug 2008 that the procurement of the services of the System Integrator / Consultant for the Computerization shall be done by PRBDB by appointing a Project Consultant. EOIs seeking the services of Project Consultant for the Computerization of PWD (B&R) have been sought by 5th Nov, 2008.

7. External Evaluation of Implementation of Resettlement Action Plan (Phase II, Package XIX) – NO from the World Bank was received 11 July 2008 for procuring the services of M/s CRADLE, an experienced NGO in this field, on Single Source Selection (SSS) method. The NGO has been asked to resubmit his proposal by 7th Oct, 2008..

Revised Procurement Plan for the next 18 months is at Appendix - 2A

2.2 Implementation Status - Civil Works

Periodic Maintenance Works

Out of ten Periodic Maintenance contracts in Phase I, for 8 contracts (PM/1, PM/2, PM/3a, PM/3b, PM/6, PM/7, PM/10 & PM/11) defect liability period has completed. For other 2 contracts, Defect Liability period of PM/4 ends in Nov 08 & that of PM/5 was extended by another two months due to inability of the Contractor to rectify the notified defects.

Total expenditure on Periodic Maintenance works till 30 September 08 is Rs. 63.50 Crore (101.48 % of original contracted cost of PM works). The increase is primarily on account of escalation payable as per contract (on bituminous work component).

Rehabilitation Works

There are six Rehabilitation works contracts in Phase I.

Progress of works especially bituminous was affected due to unprecedented and unusually vigorous rains during the quarter. However the pace of the work picked up during later part, and the progress achieved was satisfactory.

On Ferozepur Zira Dharamkot Corridor (RH/1 & RH/5), the physical progress is 41.13% & 54.37% compared to the schedule of 57.14% & 47.92% respectively (as per revised work programme). On Chandigarh Landran Sirhind Corridor (RH/2) it is 43.47% against the revised schedule of 74.43% but on the connecting corridor of Sirhind to Patiala (RH/6) the achieved progress is 96.74% to the scheduled progress of 90.52%. On Phillaur Nagar Rahon (RH/3) the progress is 35.89% against the target of 53.96%. Kapurthala Tarntaran (RH/4) corridor, which was last of all the RH contracts to start, the progress is 45.05% to the schedule of 77.96%.

The proposal to replace a section of about 8 km (of four laned portion) from the scope of Patiala Sirhind Road (RH/6) due to works done by PWD separately was examined and subsequently dropped.

Employer has allowed site mixing for PMB (change in source) due to unavailability of PMB at major refineries (IOC and BPCL). Respective Engineers were directed to issue Variation Orders accordingly, after the consent of the Contractor.

Total expenditure on RH works till 30 September 08 is Rs. 120.62 Crore (48.52% of total contracted cost of RH works)

2 variation orders of Rs. 122376 on RH/3, and Rs. (-) 278145 on RH/4 were issued during the quarter.

The status of Rehabilitation works is given in Appendix – 3.

Up gradation Works

There are three Upgradation packages in Phase-I.

On UG/1 and UG/2 (both ICB contracts) the progress is still behind the scheduled progress. On Kharar Banur Tepla (UG/1), the progress is 6.73% against the target of 9.70% and on Ludhiana Malerkotla Sangrur the progress is 6.40 % against the target of 21.24% (as per revised programme).

On UG/3, progress of work is satisfactory. Cumulative 87.80% physical progress has been achieved against the schedule of 99.09% (as per revised program). Primarily the work on bridges is remaining on account of non availability of canal closure. Extension of time for Milestone I was allowed by Engineer from 24.02.08 to 24.04.08, with no change in final completion date of 24.10.08.

Total expenditure on UG works till 30th September 08 is Rs. 85.51 Crore (22.48 % of total contracted cost of UG works)

The status of the Up gradation works is provided in Appendix - 4.

Adjudication and Dispute Resolution:

Dispute Board (DB) for ICB Contracts:

All three Dispute Boards for ICB contracts have been constituted . DB for RH/4 visited the site on 20-21 Sept 08. Site visit of DB for UG/2 is scheduled for October 15-16.

Adjudication for NCB Contracts:

On PM/1, the Employer decided to approach the Arbitrator on the decision of the Adjudicator for allowing EOT and payment of additional work.

On RH/3, a clarification pertaining to extension of time (Engineer has granted EOT of 102 days (for milestone I) and 45 days (for milestone II) whereas the adjudicator has approved EOT for 102 days) was sought by the Contractor during the site visit of the Adjudicator on 17th September 08. The Adjudicator clarified that EOT granted by the Engineer is as per the recommendation/decision of Adjudicator.

On UG/3, the dispute of seeking additional payment for the laboratory equipment by the Contractor was decided in favour of the Employer.

The status of site visits made by the Adjudicators on NCB contracts is provided in Appendix -5.

Up to 30th September 08, 223 Excise duty exemption certificates [Periodic Maintenance (19), Rehabilitation (130) & Up gradation (73)] and 4**8** Custom duty exemption certificates [Periodic Maintenance (Nil), Rehabilitation (21) & Up gradation (27)] have been issued.

Details are tabulated at Appendix – 6.

2.4 Variation Details

Periodic Maintenance contracts:

Variation orders totaling Rs 26251601/- have been issued on eight PM contracts.

Rehabilitations contracts:

2 variation orders of Rs. 122376 on RH/3, and Rs. (-) 278145 on RH/4 were issued during the quarter.

Up gradation roads:

No variation order was issued on upgradation works during the quarter.

The total value of the variation orders has not exceeded 15% of the original contract price on any contract.

2.5 Consultancy Services

Phase I

Phase I (Package II- Part B) – Technical Audit Services for Rehabilitation Works

Lead Consultant: M/s EGIS-BCEOM International, France

The Consultant M/s EGIS-BCEOM, commenced these services as a variation of Package III on 1st July, 2008 as scheduled.

Initially the CV of Resident Quality Control Specialist (a key professional) was approved provisionally, but on receipt of advice from WB the Consultant was asked to propose a another CV for this key position. Though a fresh CV was approved by the Client, the Resident Quality Control Specialist failed to report for the assignment citing personal reasons and another professional is being considered by the Consultant. The Consultant has still not mobilized all the AMEs on site.

The contract with TAC Consultant M/s ICT Pvt. Ltd was formally closed and the final payment released to them during this quarter after the receipt and scrutiny of the documents corroborating the indicating the work done.

Phase I (Package III- Part B) – Construction Supervision Consultancy Services for Up-gradation works

Lead Consultant: M/s BCEOM Societe Francaise d' Ingenierie, France

The Consultant mobilized new Resident Engineer on UG/1 package during this quarter. The CV of Senior Quantity Surveyor was not approved and the Consultant was asked to submit a fresh CV for this post.

The Consultant conducted a two day training programme on Quality Control testing and procedures at UG/1 site on 7-8 Aug & on UG/2 site on 4-5 Aug. This was well attended by the Engineers of both PWD and PRBDB.

In accordance with the provisos of the Contract Agreement, the Consultant submitted the schedule of overseas training programme in Malaysia and Singapore. The proposed list of Engineers from PWD (B&R), PSRSP divisions and PRBDB has been submitted to Government for approval.

The Consultant made the final submission of DPR of Sirhind Morinda road section in requisite hard and soft copies. However, it had been decided not to proceed ahead with the proposal to increase scope of work of RH/6 (by adding Sirhind Morinda reach) and UG/1 (by increasing four laning up to Banur Junction).

The submission from the Consultant on the MIS is still pending.

Phase I (Package IV) – Institutional Development Studies Lead consultant: M/s PricewaterhouseCoopers Pvt. Ltd., New Delhi

No action was taken during the quarter for these services. Further action shall be initiated after the Government's approval of the recommendations of the IDS Committee.

(Phase I) Package VI – RAP Implementation

Lead Consultant: M/s Development Institute for Systems Alternatives (DISA), Lucknow

Following submissions were made by the Consultant during this quarter,

For UG/1 :

Up dated data of Title-Holders on revised COI.

For UG/2 :

- i. Up-dated data of Title-Holders on revised COI.
- ii. Draft micro plan of Title-Holders for milestone I.
- iii. Revised draft micro-plan of Title-Holders of Gill, Bulara and Pohir.
- iv. Draft micro-plan of Non-Titleholders for milestone I.
- v. Draft micro-plan of village Gopalpur.
- vi. Draft micro plan of titleholders for four villages namely Kaind, Dehlon, Gopalpur and Sarinh

Except for the 2nd milestone of non-titleholder category, the Consultant has submitted all the Draft micro plans of Title Holders as well as Non-Titleholders for Ludhiana-Malerkotla section of UG/2 corridor.

Meanwhile, the Consultant has claimed the variation for the additional work. The case is in process and the Consultant has been asked to submit the supporting documents along with the details of additional work (road wise) undertaken by them.

Phase II

Phase II (Package II) – Output and Performance based Road Contracts

The draft contract for OPRC was sent to World Bank for NO on 3rd July, 2008. Upon the receipt of NO from the World Bank on 10th July, 2008, the contract Agreement with M/s Opus International Consultants Ltd, New Zealand was signed on 24th July, 2008. The services commenced on 7th Aug 2008.

The Consultant conducted the first industry consultation workshop to appraise & seek comments on the concept & proposed implementation of OPRC in Punjab on 23rd Sept 2008. This was well attended by the Contractors, Consultants and the Engineers from PWD / PRBDB.

Government has shown keen interest to extend implementation of OPRC to other parts of the state for wider impact. Upon request, the Consultant visited Muktsar, Amritsar, Kapurthala and Hoshiarpur districts to explore such a possibility. Report on possibility of including road networks in parts of Punjab under Phase II OPRC of PSRSP is awaited.

The Consultant submitted the inception report during the quarter, which was sent to the Review Committee for review on 29th Sep, 2008.

Phase II (Package III) – HIV/AIDS Awareness

Lead consultant: M/s Advantage India, New Delhi.

The revised Need Assessment Report and Campaign Implementation Plan was submitted by the Consultant on 11th & 18th Aug respectively. The activity 'one to one contact for awareness generation' was commenced by the Consultant. Under this campaign,

- Awareness generation programme on Chandigarh-Chunni- Sirhind road (RH/2) and Ludhiana Malerkotla Sangrur road (UG/2) was commenced;
- 542 small group meetings with young men/women, business community, direct force migrant labourer, drivers etc. ; and
- 3031 one to one contacts (consisting of 976 follow ups and 2055 fresh contacts).

The Consultant was asked to modify Campaign Implementation Plan following comments from the World Bank.

Phase II (Package IV) – Reclassification of State Road Network

No action was taken during the quarter for these services.

Phase II (Package V) – Preparation of GIS maps for Road network in Punjab

Lead Consultant: M/s CCE, Punjab Engineering College, Chandigarh

41 digitized toposheets were supplied by SoI during the quarter. The total sheets supplied till the end of September are 267 sheets + 3 outriggers (for balance area up to international border with Pakistan), out of a total requirement of 366 sheets. The Consultant supplied 199 A3 size toposheets during this quarter.

Cumulatively, 3,118 A3 size toposheets have been forwarded to the concerned 42 PWD Divisions so far for ground truthing. The response from PWD (B&R) on toposheets submitted for ground truthing is extremely limited. However, efforts are being made to expedite. The Consultant has further requested for 6 month's extension of time on 25th July, 2008 due to delay in sheets from SOI which is under review.

Meanwhile, review meeting was conducted with Director General, SOI, GDC (Geospatial Data Centre) during this quarter to expedite the supply of maps by SoI.

In order to apprise PWD staff on the GIS activities and ongoing project, three workshops were held during this quarter at Ludhiana, Patiala and Jalandhar on 4th July, 8th July and 22nd July, 2008 respectively.

Phase II (Package VI) – Integrated Transport Sector Master Plan

The RFP for these services was issued to the six shortlisted consultants on 22nd July, 2008 with last date of submission of proposals being 18th Sep, 2008. The pre-proposal meeting for the services was held as scheduled on 18th Aug, 2008 in which all the queries raised verbally or written were replied to satisfactorily. On receipt of NO from WB, the minutes of the pre-proposal meeting were issued on 29th Aug, 2008.

On consultants' request, the last date of submission of proposals was extended to 6th Oct, 2008 from 18th Sep 2008. The corrigendum to this effect was issued on 4th Sep, 2008.

After securing the consent of WB, the Client agreed to allow M/s ROM Transport Consultant Ltd. and M/s Phoenix Engineering and Research Limited to associate M/s LEA associates South Asia Pvt. Ltd. as their sub consultants instead of Joint Venture partnership for submission of the proposal. It may be noted that M/s LEA Associate South Asia Pvt. Ltd, New Delhi had separately submitted expression of interest in individual capacity for this consultancy and was not shortlisted.

Phase II (Package VII) – Road & Traffic Safety Awareness

The progress on proposed services of M/s ArriveSafe for Road Safety Awareness was limited to few meetings during this period. The procurement of this NGO on single source basis has been kept in temporary abeyance due to pending information from this NGO.

Procurement of GPS instruments is still pending due to the issue of differential sales tax and its impact on lowest evaluated bid. Pending final decision on the preferred bidder, all the bidders have been requested to extend their bid validities. Reminders are being issued to the excise and taxation departments of Delhi & Mumbai regions for seeking clarification regarding applicable CST/VAT rate.

Complete information regarding estimated cost for improvement of unmanned level crossings is still awaited from PWD.

Phase II (Package VIII) – Road Fund Secretariat

Finance Department of GOP had forwarded the draft scheme of operationlising the Road Maintenance Fund to Accountant General Punjab. Formal approval from Accountant General Punjab is still awaited. Their preliminary objection is on creating such a fund off the Government books. They have instead recommended setting up this fund as a Public Account. Meeting was held with AG office to expedite the matter. AG agreed to resolve the matter at the earliest. Further action on these services shall be taken after the final approval of Government on creation of road fund.

Phase II (Package IX) – Asset Management Software Development and Training

No action was taken during the quarter for these services.

Phase II (Package X) – Training IT, Contract Management, Quality Control and Procurement

No action was taken during the quarter for these services.

M/s Idma Foundation for Sustainable Development submitted their first draft of environment management plan training inception report on 16th July 2008. During review of the inception report feedbacks were provided in the need assessment questionnaire. The final draft of the report was submitted on 25th July 2008. The final inception report for pollution monitoring was sent to World Bank for comments. The revised inception report of Pollution Monitoring was submitted by the Consultant after incorporating the bank's comments. Both these reports have also been approved by the Review Committee.

The monitoring schedule for the assignment was approved and the first batch of pollution monitoring at all construction sites has been completed. The analysis results are yet to be submitted.

The EMP Training Inception report has also been sent to the World Bank for comments. The questionnaire for Training needs assessment was approved. The Consultant has completed the Training Needs Assessment survey (questionnaire & Individual Consultation). The first draft of Training Needs Assessment report has been submitted for comments and feedback on 22nd September 2008.

The Testing Manual for pollution monitoring preparation is in progress. The first batch monitoring result report is yet to be submitted.

Phase II (Package XII) – Training – Financial Management

No action was taken during the quarter for these services.

Phase II (Package XIII) – Road Safety Database, Training etc

M/s ArriveSafe (proposed consultant for Road Safety Awareness) was identified to develop web based Accident Data system for multiple data input & wider utility in place of current basic module used on a single system.

No Objection has been received from the World Bank on 23rd September for procuring services of this Consultant based on Single Source Selection for developing online Accident data base management system. It is expected that the contract agreement will be signed in the month of October 08.

Phase II (Package XIV) – Surveys (Road user, Pavement condition, speed, etc.)

Approval of Government for signing of the Contract agreement for the services of Road User satisfaction has been received during the quarter. The Consultant has been asked to confirm the availability of key professionals as per the proposal. It expected that the contract agreement will be signed in the first week of October 08.

Phase II (Package XV) – Feasibility Studies & Advisory Services for Preparation of PPP

No action was taken during this quarter for these services.

Phase II (Package XVI) – Computerization of PWD (B&R)

In a meeting chaired by Chief Secretary with Secretary Public Works, Director IT and PD on 26th Aug 2008, it was decided that the procurement of these services shall be done by PRBDB by appointing a Project Consultant.

A limited mission led by Mr. Rajesh Rohatgi and comprising of Mr. Shashank Ojha and Mr. Pradeep Valsangkar (IT specialists) visited PRBDB in the first week of September. Discussions were held with Director IT, & PD/DPD PSRSP to finalize the strategy for Computerization of PWD B&R. It was decided to first initiate the procurement of Project Consultant to assist the Client in selection of the System Integrator / Consultant for the computerization of PWD.

EOIs seeking the services of Project Consultant for the Computerization of PWD (B&R) have been sought by 5th Nov, 2008.

Phase II (Package XVII) – DPR Consultancy for Rehabilitation of affected reaches of PM/6.

TOR for these services is being drafted.

Phase II (Package XVIII) –Services of Internal Auditor for PSRSP.

TOR for these services is being re-drafted.

Phase II (Package XIX) – External Evaluation of Implementation of Resettlement Action Plan

M/s CRADLE, an experienced NGO, has been shortlisted based on Single Source Selection (SSS) method and NO from the World Bank was obtained. The NGO has been asked to resubmit their proposal by 7th Oct, 2008 after attending to observed shortcomings.

2.6 Implementation of Environment Management Plan

Inspection of Construction Sites:

PM (Environment) found discernable decline in EMP compliance on Rehabilitation works. Though it is a primary responsibility of the Contractor there were reported lapses on part of the Engineer's monitoring and supervision as well. The Engineer has been asked to exercise greater vigilance against non compliance.

On Up-Gradation works, EMP compliance was not satisfactory at UG1 but at UG/2 increased compliances was observed , but it still requires improvement. The Engineers were directed to be vigilant while rehabilitation of borrow area and disposal site management.

Traffic Management: Traffic Safety Management was also found not to be satisfactory, predominantly on road corridors where earth work is in progress. Perhaps one of the reasons for this is opening of many new work fronts. Engineers/Contractors were advised to plan the activities in such a manner so that the Traffic on the project roads can be easily managed.

Worker's Safety: Overall the compliance to PPE is mildly satisfactory during this quarter. The absence of contractors own PPE implementation strategy and ineffective enforcement by the Engineer was noted as one of the major cause for the lapse. In order to ensure proper compliance to safety of labourers, the Engineer and the Contractor were advised to conduct safety audit after every 15 days.

Disposal Site: A total of 15 disposal sites have been identified under this project. 8 numbers were identified under rehabilitation and 7 under up-gradation packages respectively. The package wise detail of disposal sites identified is as below:

Inspection of Construction Camps

Rehabilitation Works

There are 5 construction camps for RH works. During this quarter, the overall compliance was mildly satisfactory and still needs improvement on all construction camps.

Up-gradation Works

With identification of one more construction camp at km 52.820 (LHS) at UG2 package, there are 5 construction camps under up-gradation works. Of the total, 3 construction camps are in UG2 and one each in UG1 & UG3. The camp's management needs improvement especially at plant sites.

Borrow Area

In case of rehabilitation and up-gradation, a total of thirty six borrow areas have been identified and approved. Contract package wise breakup is tabulated below.

TA / CS Consultant

The environmental specialist of CSC was on site during month of July and August. The EO of UG1 was absent till 24th August and the replacement was mobilised on 25th August, 2008.

Others

- The CSC conducted two trainings for CMU and contractor's personal on 10th and 11th July, 2008.
- Environmental specialist conducted a meeting on 28th July 2008, to check compliance, which was well attended by Environment officer (UG2) CSC and the Contractors.
- A project implementation information meeting was conducted on UG2.
- Unregulated labour camps outside the camp sites were noticed at few locations. The Engineer was directed to check this practice as this amounts to violation of EMP condition.

2.7 Resettlement & Rehabilitation Activities

Overall 86.94 % of land has been acquired and Rs. 52.61 crores have been distributed as land compensation and R&R assistance.

On UG1 and UG2, revision of COI due to modified drain design has been completed. Owing to reduction in COI, requirement of private land has been reduced to 50.006 acre. Overall Land acquisition status is tabulated below,

OVERALL LAND ACQUISITION STATUS

Under the project, total of 891 title-holders families, 304 non-titleholders families have been identified. Though initially delayed owing to changed COI and corresponding reduced PAPs, preparation of Micro plans is well underway.

Shifting of CPRs is slow but in progress on all Up gradation and Rehabilitation roads.

Ludhiana-Malerkotla Sangrur Corridor (UG/2)

- Land compensation and R&R payment of Rs 483015300/- (Rs. Forty eight crore Thirty lacs Fifteen thousand Three hundred only) has been disbursed to the Title Holders and Non Titleholders.
- For disputed title holding and absentees land owners, notification under Section 9 of LA Act is in process. As on date notification for three villages namely Phallewal, Bhogiwal and Malakpur, Tehsil-Malerkotla, district Sangrur ((milestone-I of UG/II corridor) has been issued on 8th September 08 by the concerned Sub-Divisional Magistrate.
- Following outcome of the public consultation meeting held in village Gill (during last quarter) regarding issue of severance allowance, Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC) meetings under the chairmanship of Addl. Distt. & Sessions Judge (Retd), Mr. S. K. Sharma were held on 30 August 08 and 10 September 08. The Committee recommended paying severance allowance equivalent to 25% of the award value to the entitled persons. The case has been submitted to the GOP for seeking final approval.

Kharar-Banur-Tepla Corridor (UG/1)

 Land Compensation and R&R payment of Rs 4,22,16,646 (Rs. Four crores twenty two lacs sixteen thousand six hundred and forty six only) has been disbursed to the Title Holders till date.

TarnTaran-Chhabal-Attari Corridor (UG/3)

- Disbursement of R&R assistance has been completed and report on need assessment survey is awaited from NGO.
- Shifting of CPRs is under process.

 R&R assistance to two non available NTH is pending. Report on need assessment survey for income restoration is awaited from NGO. NGO is in process of preparing supplementary micro plan to compensate damages to septic tank, which was envisaged during excavation of the road corridor. Shifting of CPRs is under process.

Rehabilitation Corridors

• Shifting of CPRs is in progress on RH/1, RH/2, RH/4 and RH/5.

Detailed status regarding implementation of Resettlement Action Plan is at Appendix - 9.

2.8 **Pre Construction Activities:**

A) Works where Forest Clearance awaited:

Rehabilitation roads:

Patiala Sirhind road (RH/6) : Forest clearance for diversion of 1.5 ha of forest land under forest division Fatehgarh Sahib is awaited. Funds for seeking final approval stands deposited with forest department (In Principle approval was accorded in year 2003). State Forest department is yet to send a reply to MoEF pertaining to observation raised vide their letter dated 22nd August 08.

B) Forest Clearance received during the quarter:

1) Patiala Sirhind road (RH/6) :

Final Forest Clearance has been received for diversion of

- 0.718 ha of forest land under Forest division Patiala.
- 0.2014 ha of forest land under Forest division Fatehgarh sahib.

2) Chandigarh Sirhind road (RH/2):

MoEF has accorded final forest clearance for cutting of additional 116 trees.

3) Zira Ferozepur road (RH/1):

Final Forest clearance has been given by MoEF for diversion of 1.23 ha of forest land for improvement of 5 junctions under Forest Division Ferozepur.

- On UG/1, in mile stone I additional 30 trees for which clearance was received in the month of June 08 have been felled. After consulting Forest Department, the contractor has been asked to remove those small trees which had grown after initial felling.
- On UG/2, Malerkotla Sangrur section, 97% tree cutting has been completed. Though cutting of balance trees by the forest department is slow but it does not hinder the work and the contractor has not exercised 'Step-in-rights' rights so far.

Electric Utilities:

- The issue of slow progress of shifting of electric utilities on project roads especially UG/2 was brought to the notice of State Level Empowered Committee in the meeting held on 28th August 08. The committee directed the PSEB officers to complete the relocation work on the road corridor in a time bound manner.
- Following the discussions during State Level Empowered Committee, Chief Engineer, PSEB was requested vide letter dated 26th September 08 to expedite shifting of poles.

UG/1:

 Relocation of electric utilities is ongoing by the contractor through variation order. Executive Engineer, Mohali has requested PSEB for submission of 2 awaited estimates (pertaining to Kharar and Rajpura PSEB divisions).

• Raising of high tension line at km 21 of UG/1: Owing to ongoing court case between PSEB and the land owner, District Magistrate Patiala was requested to grant permission under section 16 of Indian Telegraph Act for installing an additional tower for raising of overhead transmission line across the road corridor. District Magistrate Patiala, has accorded necessary permission for the same on 7th July 08 under the Indian Telegraph Act. PSEB is in process of seeking final permission from the court. The court has fixed 17th October 08 for hearing of the case.

UG/2:

• On UG/2 (Ludhiana Malerkotla Sangrur road), shifting of electric utilities is getting critical. On 'Ludhiana Malerkotla' section, relocation of electric utilities has reduced owing to change in COI. During the quarter, the joint verification regarding remaining electric poles and transformers was undertaken by representative of Employer, Engineer and the Contractor. As on date 488 electric utilities on 'Ludhiana Malerkotla' section and 276 electric utilities on 'Malerkotla' Sangrur' section are yet to be shifted.

UG/3:

• During the quarter, relocation of utilities has been completed on UG/3.

Rehabilitation roads:

- On 'Zira Ferozepur' road (RH/1), shifting of additional electric utilities (approx. 26 poles), necessitated due to improvement of junctions, has commenced.
- Relocation of utilities has been completed on RH/2 and RH/4.
- On RH/3, 95% of electric utilities have been relocated.

E) Public Heath Utilities:

- On all milestone-I sections of project roads, shifting of Public health utilities is complete, except for RH/3 where 93% pipe line has been shifted and remaining shall be shifted while executing the road work.
- For milestone-II,
 - UG/1: shifting of pipe line has started but is at slow pace. Out of total 6714 m of total pipe line, 1265 m (19%) of pipe line has been relocated.
 - ii. UG/2 (Ludhiana Malerkotla section): relocation of pipe line is planned during execution of road work.
 - iii. UG/2 (Malerkotla Sangrur section): shifting of pipeline has been completed.
 - iv. RH/1(Zira Ferozepur): shifting of pipe line has been completed.
 - v. **RH/3 & RH/5**: shifting of public health utilities is in progress.

The status of shifting of electric and public health utilities on the project roads is at Appendix 10.

3 Seminars, Workshops & Trainings

Training on Road safety, RTI Act and GIS was held on 25th July 08 at Patiala.
 The training was attended by the PWD (B&R) officers.

- A training programme on Quality Control test for different construction materials and its implementation at site was conducted on 7th & 8th August, 2008 for UG/1 package and on 4th & 5th Aug, 2008 for package UG/2 by Quality Assurance cum pavement specialist of M/s Egis Bceom International, France during this period which was well attended by the officers of PWD & PRBDB.
- Executive Engineers of Ferozepur & Sangrur attended two day training Seminar on 21-22 Aug on FIDIC based 'Management of Contract Claims and Resolution of Disputes' conducted by Consulting Engineers Association of India, New Delhi.
- Industry consultative workshop on OPRC was held on 23rd September by the Consultant, to appraise & seek comments on the concept & proposed implementation of OPRC in Punjab which was well attended by the Contractors, Engineers (from PRBDB & PWD) and the Consultants.
- The CSC, M/s Egis Bceom International, conducted two Environmental trainings for CMU and contractor's personal on 10th and 11th July, 2008
- The Consultant, M/s Egis Bceom International, submitted the schedule of overseas training programme in Malaysia and Singapore, for which approval of the Government has been sought.

4 Complaints

The proposed action from Director Quality Control cum Vigilance Officer on pseudonymous complaint against the Executive Engineer, Mohali is still pending.

No new complaint has been received during this quarter.

5 Court Cases

The court cases of Mr. Ashok Singh and Mr. Balraj Singh were decided on 1st August 08 by the court. Subsequent to the decision, the conveyance deeds were signed.

1st November 08 has been fixed for next hearing in the court case pertaining to division of land among share holders filed in the court of Civil Judge (Junior Division), Ludhiana by the applicant Mr. Sukhdev Singh.

The agenda was discussed and the following decisions were taken:

Agenda Item No. 1: Confirmation of Minutes of 8th meeting

The Minutes of the 8th meeting of the State Level Empowered Committee held on 6th August, 2007 were confirmed.

Agenda Item No. 2: Action Taken on the decision taken in the 8th meeting of State Level Empowered Committee.

The Committee noted the action taken on the decisions taken in the 8th meeting of State Level Empowered Committee.

Agenda Item No. 3: Status report of Punjab State Road Sector Project (PSRSP)

The Committee was apprised of the progress made on the Project. Secretary Public Works highlighted the OPRC Contract in Phase II. Committee took note of this new pilot. Some suggestions on inclusions of service criteria e.g. on accident etc. were made. Project Director assured that the suggested issues shall be duly covered during the contract formulation. The Committee noted the progress made on the project.

Agenda Item No. 4: Status of utility shifting under PSRSP

The Committee noted with concern the slow progress on the removal of electrical utilities. Chief Secretary directed the PSEB officials to complete the removal of electric utilities in a time

bound manner (especially on Ludhiana – Malerkotla – Sangrur corridor) in coordination with the project authorities.

Agenda Item No. 5: Creation of Punjab State Road Maintenance Fund

Principal Secretary Finance explained that the revised proposal submitted by PWD (B&R) has been sent to AG for their final comments. He informed that on formal approval, the maintenance fund shall become operational and the first instalment shall be released. It was decided that Project Authority shall pursue the case with AG for early resolution of this issue.

Agenda Item No. 6: Devising an Integrated Transport Policy for Punjab

The committee noted the action taken so far. Approval was accorded to the formation of Steering Committee under the chairmanship of Principal Secretary Transport.

Agenda Item No. 7: Proposal for Resettlement sites for Project Displaced Families (PDFs) under PSRSP

Project Director presented both the proposals to the Committee. These were approved inprinciple. Project Authorities shall take follow up action as per rules and procedures.

Agenda Item No. 8: Computerization of PWD (B&R)

SPW informed the Committee that a separate meeting on computerization of PWD (B&R) was held by Chief Secretary on 26.08.08 and it has been resolved that PRBDB shall retain a Project Consultant using World Bank procurement guidelines. Such a consultant shall identify and map common processes of Department, finalise software/hardware requirements and provide assistance in procurement of Consultant/Service Provider for the final implementation.
